

Objectives of the Course : This course aims at providing students with a background in international law by studying the fundamentals of the regime governing the interactions between states.

Description of the Course : The first half of the course will focus on the pillars of public international law (PIL). A selection of substantive topics will be covered such as: the incorporation in national law; the sources and the subjects of the system; statehood; the law of international treaties; aspects of the institutional framework of international law; and state responsibility for internationally wrongful acts. During the second half of the course, students will discover and study a PIL topic with the collaboration of the professor.

Teaching Method : Lecture/seminar discussion/engaged pedagogy

Method of Evaluation : Participation, midterm (closed books), oral presentation and final legal paper
